New York, Oct. 18.-An impressive ceremony was held last Thursday at the Altar of Liberty in Madison square, 23d street and Fifth avenue, under the auspices of the Liberty Loan committee of New York City in honor of the Republic of Liberia as one of the twenty-two allied nations united in the overthrow of Prussian autocracy and militarism. The Liberian delegation met at the Waldorf-Astoria, 34th street and Fifth avenue, at 11:30 a. m., from whence the party was conducted under military escort down Fifth avenue to the Altar of Liberty in Madison square, where the ceremonies were held.
