OHIO REPUB. CONVENTION IS OPPOSED TO LYNCHING

Columbus, Ohio, July 9.—The Ohio state Republican convention held in this city June 29 made a part of its platform resolutions submitted by W. S. Scarborough, Thomas W. Fleming and Charles A. Cottrell. The resolutions read as follows "We stand for that brand of Americanism which contemplates the welfare of and pledges itself to the real protection of every American citizen, regardless of racial extraction, in the enjoyment of all his rights and privileges guaranteed by the federal constitution." The plank further discusses lynching and other crimes against law and order and asks for an enactment of a federal law to safeguard the rights of our people.
