NOTABLES AT Schomburg's Final Rites

Simple Funeral Is **Held** For Distinguished Race Scholar

NEW YORK, June 24—In a small church in Brooklyn, the Rev. George S. Stark, pastor of Siloam Presbyterlan church, 404 Lafayette avenue, conducted the last rites for Arthur Alonzo Schomburg, internationally famous scholar, curator, and bibliophile on Race literature

Schomburg. 64, died suddenly last Friday as a result of a tooth infection which confined him in the Madison Park hospital. He was buried in Cypress Hills cemetery.

The funeral services, attended by many literary leaders of both races, were short and simple. Among the honorary pallbearers were, Yasuich Hikada of Tokyo, Dr. P. M. H. Savory, Dr. Alain Locke and Dr. Charles S. Johnson of Fisk.

His death was deplored by many leaders including James Weldon Johnson, Robert A. Pelham of the American Negro Academy and H. M. Lydenberg, director of the New York public library.

Many letters and telegrams were received by his survivors, his widow and eight children who reside at 105 Kosciusko street, Brooklyn.
