## PHILADELPHIA'S UNITED CAMPAIGN OPENS



Civic and welfare workers of both races joined in the opening dinner-meeting which recently opened Philadelphia's annual United Campaign. A total of 1,800 people filled the grand ballroom of the Bellevue-Stratford hotel and overflowed into adjoining rooms. These represented some 8,000 other solicitors who must raise \$4,000,000 by the end of the month, for the support of 141 hospitals, nurseries, clinics, orphanages and recreation centers. At the speakers' table, in top panel, is Dr.
