

# La Guardia Announces A New Project

NEW YORK, Nov. 24—Mayor Fiorello H. LaGuardia of New York took the occasion of the Centennial Celebration of the Lincoln School for Nurses, the Bronx, to announce a new slum clearance project for "somewhere" in the Bronx.

Pointing out that the city was making great strides in providing hospitals to care for the sick, the Mayor said that it was also trying to get to the root of the sickness and eliminate its causes. Slum clearance projects, he explained to the 500 nurses and guests, are great steps in this direction.

The Mayor had flown early in the afternoon from a Washington conference with housing administration officials that he might join other civic and philanthropic leaders in paying tribute to the school for its century of progress.

Other speakers included Mrs. John P. Hazen Perry, president of the board of managers of the Lincoln School for Nurses; Leslie Pinckney Hill, president of Cheyney School for Teachers; Isabel M. Stewart, director of Nursing Education Division of Teachers college, Columbia university, and James G. Blaine, president of the Greater New York Fund. The Rev. Harold S. Rambo, minister of Adams Memorial Presbyterian church, 207 East Thirtieth street, delivered the invocation.
