NEW YORK, Feb. 2--Six-l teen noted leaders have joined with 69 white distinguished Americans in the sponsorship of the fourth annual National Sharecroppers Week which will be observed from March 4 through March 10, it was announced this week by Miss Pauli Murray, secretary of the movement.

Philip Raniolph, president of the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters, J.
