

Club Women Will Discuss U. S. Defense

CHEYNEY, Pa.—(ANP)—Women and national defense will color the thirty-eighth annual convention of the Pennsylvania State Federation of Negro Women's clubs, being held on the campus of Cheyney State Teachers' college this week, Monday through Wednesday, July 14-16, with Mrs. Adelaide Harty Fleming, R.N., of Philadelphia, presiding.

Besides the many reports from committees and clubs, the "Community Night" program on Monday will hear Mrs. Daisy E. Lampkin, Pittsburgh, field secretary of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, who will tell how organized civic and women's groups are preparing for and meeting the emergency.

G. James Fleming, chairman, the Philadelphia committee on the Participation of the Negro in National Defense, will tell the "Why and How of Negro Participation," and Mrs. Anna Broadnax, president, the National Negro Business and Professional Women's clubs, will speak on "Past Achievements—Challenge for the Future."

Dr. Leslie Pinckney Hill, president of the state college, will give the official welcome, to which the response will be given by Mrs. Maude B. Coleman, interracial consultant, the state department of welfare.
