Na-tive Texan, Wiley and Wilberforce graduate, he moves soft-spoken and effortlessly from success to success. Eighteen years secretary to Book-er T. Washington, he was an unsung motivating force behind robust growth of Tuskegee (1897-1915). His, Also, was task of nurturing Na-tioval Negro Business league, Tuskegue inceptioned, for 20 years. Dis-patched by President Taft aboard U.S. Cruiser "Chester" on American Commission to Liberia (1909), he laid foundation of Liberian-American accord, bearing current fruit. Secretary to 1912 International Con-ference on Negro, he was appointed special assistant to the Secretary of War during the World war, and acquired invaluable insight into Negro as a soldier. As secretary-treasurer of Howard university four-teen years (1919-1933) and later secretary, he proved master of the art of persuading reluctant Congress to appropriate adequate funds for maintenance and growth of university. Author of "The American Negro in the World War," migratory, and other studies, his was the persuasiveness staying rapidly closing doors in the diplomatic corps, threatening to close Negroes out of the foreign service. He's unofficial dean of the Negro diplomats. Ardent and unwavering Republican, he has served on Republican National and Special committee, and is currently Race Relations of-ficer for the national committee. His widely-read pithy weekly com-ments in the Negro Press on race relations in general as they affect the Negro, astutely contain no reference to politics except in election-ave times.
