The women made their reports at a Nov. 14 public luncheon under the theme "How Fare Wom-en Around the World." The luncheon was held in the Statler-Hilton's South American room.

Pointing to the convention's general theme "Women's Role in Community Leadership'' - and stating that the scope of the community in which NCNW leaders are interested is international as well as local and national, the convention's planners are staging still another program on the international scene.
