

Pioneer Of Baha'i To Climax Meet

William Sears, author, teacher, former CBS-TV director and UP correspondent and a Baha'i pioneer, will climax Baha'i's 51st national convention with a talk on "This Earth One County," April 25, at the organization's House of Worship in Wilmette.

Seven-hundred delegates are expected to attend the three-day meeting, April 23-26.

Sears, of South Africa and Haifa, Israel, has just returned from South Africa where he has been directing Baha'i's activities since 1953. He is a Chief Steward of Baha'i and is former chairman of the first Baha'i National Assembly of South and West Africa.

The purpose of the convention is to elect the National Spiritual Assembly of the Baha'i of the United States and to consult on the completion of the 10-year crusade initiated in 1953.
