Harding Museum (in South Chicago); Lincoln Park Zoo, and the Chicago Historical Society; the Chicago Academy Brookfield Zoo, of Sciences, and Trailside Museum (in Lincoln Park).

In the environs the following are featured as points of interest to children: Morton Arboretum, the Robert Mc-Cormick Museum and Gar-dens, the Pepperidge Farm Bakery, the Dearborn Observatory, the Baha'i House of Worship, Hawthorne - Mellody Dairy Farm, Santa's Village, and the Ford Assembly Plant.
