## Anniversary Of Baha'i Religion Observed Mon.

The 146th anniversary of the birth of Baha'u'llah, founder of the Baha'i Faith, will be commemorated 8 p. m., Monday, Nov. 11, at the Baha'i Temple, Linden Ave., and Sheridan Rd., Wilmette, Ill.

Baha'u'llah was born Nov. 12, 1817 in Teheran, Iran and in 1863 publicly proclaimed that he was the Promised One foretold in the sacred scriptures of all divinely revealed religions. For forty years Baha'u'llah suffered exile, imprisonment and torture for his teachings.

There is no clergy or ritual in the Baha'i World Faith. Baha'u'llah's teachings of the oneness of mankind have attracted believers from every religious, racial and national background.
