To Talk On Faith

At Baha'i Sunday

WILMETTE, Ill. — David W. Kellum, a former city editor of the Chicago Daily Defender, will speak at the Baha'i House of Worship Sunday, April 14, at 3:45 p.m. His topic will be "What Is the Baha'i Faith?"

The House of Worship is located at Sheridan Road and Linden ave., Wilmette.

Kellum, creator of the famous Bud Billiken Day celebration for children, graduated from Wendell Phillips High School and attended the Northwestern University School of Journalism. He is now director of Kellum's Employment Agency.

He is chairman of the Spiritual Assembly of the Baha'is of Chicago, the elected administrative body of the Baha'i Faith

for the city.

Kellum's lecture Sunday is one of a series of informative talks at the Baha'i House of Worship every Sunday at 3:45 p.m., following a 3:00 p.m. devotional program.

In the Baha'i Faith there are no clergy; every believer is expected to teach his Faith in the way best suited to himself.

Baha'u'llah, the Prophet-founder of the Faith, laid this duty on every Baha'i, Kellum said. At the public lectures at the House of Worship, Baha'is from all walks of life present various aspects of the teachings of their Faith, and at fireside discussions after the lectures, speakers and visitors informally discuss matters of interest, he added.
