At the National Baha'i Center n Wilmette, Illinois, the Centenary will be observed with devotions in the main auditorium of the world-famous Baha'i House of Worship at 8:30 p.m. on August 31st.

This will be followed by a talk in Foundation Hall by Dr. Manucher Javid, Professor and Chairman of the Department Neurosurgery, School Medicine, at the University of!

Wisconsin. Dr. Javid's talk, will also deal with the teaching entitled "An Ancient Prophecy | Fulfilled", will cover the historic events surrounding Bahaullah's journey and its significance. The public is invited to the devotions and Dr. Javid's

Bahaullah was exiled from His native Persia because of His religious Teachings. He was first banished to Baghdad. In May 1863. He and a small group of His followers were taken to Constantinople and! later to Adrainople.

Finally by decree of Sultan Abdul-Aziz. He was sent to Akka, in the Holy Land where He was imprisoned. He and His fellow exiles set sail from Gallipoli on August 21, 1868 aboard A u strain-Lloyd a n steamer bound for Haifa. arriving on August 31st.
