

Delegates to peace convention

WILMETTE, III. Mitchell, secreford Mitches secretary of sembly of the Baha'is of the United States will attend the World World Conference Religion and held in Kyoto, Peace Japan, in October 16-21. He will be an official delegate representing the American Baha'i Community. Some 300 leaders representing the major world religions will convene in the ancient Japanese capital to discuss issues of development human rights, and disarmmament.

Mitchell in a statement on his appointment said: "I am looking forward with delight and some measure of anxiety to this historic international event. There will be no real peace in the world until religions have reconciled their differences and begun to exert a unifying influence in the affairs of mankind. It is my earnest hope that my participation in this timely conference will contribute to the eventual resolution of the issues barring mankind the attaintment of from ternational lasting and

peace.' The purposes of this unique World Conference are to share among religious leaders of the world the knowledge of sanctions and teachings that each major reings that each major re-ligion has for the achieve-ment of world peace and for just international relations. Also, to find the common religious principles regarding peace and to clarify and stress the role of religion

in the affairs of men.
