Dear Harriet!

The Master said: - When the Cause is well-founded in Paris, there will be other emotions, other susceptibilities and other attractions. Although Paris compared with other ^{countries} places is showing, in a general way little attention to spiritual problems, of life yet under the education and training of Our Beloved there are signs and traces of ~~the~~ spiritual spring time. Once the Master leaves ^{in fatigue} this field of labor then people will become awakened as though from a deep slumber and ^{knows} ~~walks~~ who was amongst them and what wonderful teachings he has left behind! Then to their great disappointment they will realize that they could not get all the wealth ~~elsewhere~~ that they ~~can never~~ off the world the gift that

get for the wealth of the whole world
~~that~~ ^{from Abdul Baha} they could receive freely without
money and without price! at this
time. What is this? To behold the
Countenance of the Beloved; to hear a few
words of benediction from His Holy lips; to
stand in His Presence and to serve
Him in the ^{every} ~~smallest~~ possible way.
These Favors have been showered upon
so many people in America and espe-
cially upon so many believers. I hope
everyone ~~of them~~ will appreciate
deeply these divine Gifts and in
order to demonstrate ~~their~~ ^{his}
appreciation ~~they~~ will arise to
spread the message and make
mindful those who are
heedless. The seeds which are
scattered by ~~Ourselves~~ ^{Aldus Baha} in America
must be well watered - so that
millions of honest ^{may be} ~~All~~ gathered,
If every one of the friends decides
to really teach one soul in a year,
^{every} next year at time the number ^{would be} is
doubled.

This morning immediately after drinking tea the Master called me to go out with him. It was hardly eight o'clock. He called on M^r. and Madame Dreyfus; they were of course sleep but soon M^r. Dreyfus was in his presence. After a ~~few minutes~~^{while} Madame Dreyfus ^{too} came in. The Master talked with M^r. Dreyfus about a most prominent Persian statesman ~~who~~ has just arrived from Azarbaijan. M^r. Dreyfus had already invited him ^{to} dinner for Tuesday night so that he may meet ~~again~~ the Master. He said, that during an interview with him he had related to him the wonderful visit of the Beloved ^{to} America and his addresses before Universities, Colleges, churches, Clubs etc. ^{he} was much impressed. After awhile the Master returned home and I presented to him the petitions

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of some of the friends and He revealed
wonderful Tablets for each. Then
~~about~~ at half past ten Madame Dreyfus
announced the presence of several
new people who were longing to
have a few moments each with
the Master. I ~~retired~~ from the
field leaving it to others. I have
no doubt that all those people
who ^{meet Abdul Baha} go in the presence of Our
Lord receive such a heavenly
Benediction that they never forget
it ^{will} throughout all their lives. Each hour spent
in his nearness at His divine
Threshold is equal to an age. In the
storm and stress of time, we may
not ^{have time to} think of this as ~~will be just~~
~~now~~ but in the near future,
we will dwell on these ^{days} ~~hours~~
as the most precious ~~hours~~
ⁱⁿ our lives. The greatest
gift in this world is the love
and kindness of a Blessed Personage
who only thinks of one's progress
and illumination.

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It was past twelve when the Master entered the Parlor to greet the waiting crowd. He smiled his heavenly smile that winning the hearts and attracting the souls. His talk was against the theories of the agnostics who say ~~there is~~ ^{claim that} nothing beyond this physical life, that after this, there is an eternal sleep. Then he summed up his address: — ^{No} I hoped ^{of those who were present} that ^{the} your intellectual power may advance, ^{then} your ideal knowledge may grow in proportion and the circle of ^{their} thoughts may widen ^{thus} expand; — so that ^{they} you may discover the divine worlds — worlds which are infinite. Just as these phenomena are infinite as regards to their forms and species, likewise the worlds of God are ^{very} infinite. May every ~~day~~ ^{every day} ~~new~~ ^{new} man become informed ^{every day} with a new mystery! ~~Every day~~

~~May they~~ ^{every day} ~~you may be~~ obtain a new life,
~~everyday~~ ^{May they} ~~you~~ ^{will everyday} ~~may~~ ^{they} discover a new
reality — so that ~~you~~ ^{they} may find
entrance to all the worlds of
God.

The Master went out with Doctor
Mohammed Khan and on his return
he had dinner. Two Persian Students
who had come from Versailles met
the Beloved and then he had his
nap. In the afternoon Madame
de Saey with her mother and four
children and Madame D' Astie came
to see Our Beloved. As the
daughters are being educated in
the Catholic Convent, they have
become most devout and
^{in that faith} zealous. Half-jokingly — half-
seriously the Master carried
a religious discussion with
one of the young girls whom
I think is not older than
14 or 15 yrs old. She was clever
in her own way, quoting the

verses from
the toucher

traditions of the church, portions
of the bible etc etc. The talk
was most interesting as it dealt of
baptism, the interpretation of the
Word; the ^{saying} ~~claim~~ of John the Baptist
that he was not Chas, and Christ
saying that he was. At last
the Master finished the discussion
by saying: - Christ and the Bible
~~be~~ for us; the Pope and all the
priests be for you. We follow
Christ and not the priests.
We give more importance
to what Christ said than
what the Popes and ^{the} Cardinal
say. We are the followers of
Christ. We love him and are
always ready to sacrifice
our lives for him. At
this time Rashed Pasha and
Munir Pasha (former Ambassador
of Turkey to this country)
and the discussion came
to an end.

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Both of them kissed the hands of the Master. For more than one hour the Beloved spake to them in Turkish about America, his tour and his 40 yrs of imprisonment. When they left, he was ~~most fatigued~~^{very tired}. He ~~went~~ ^{went} to his room to rest for a few minutes ~~and~~ when Hassrat told - Daabt with his younger brother ~~came in. He arrived he.~~ came out of his room to meet them. They arose from their seats. ~~and he~~ He welcomed them. Although he was very tired yet he spoke with them for a full hour. Some of the things he said: - Sultan Abdul Hamid impri-
soned ~~so far~~^{him} forty years. Were free during ~~these forty years~~^{the} ~~now~~ this would have been widely cause was well - spread in America and Europe ~~and the union of the East & the West myself have been~~
~~world have brought to him~~
~~realized~~ much progress. At one time Abdul Hamid became very suspicious

because his spies reported to him⁹
that Abbas Effendi ^{was} carrying a large
correspondence with America. So I
gathered 250 letters which had
just arrived and mailed them to the
Sultan's
private Secretary to be translated
and ~~shown~~^{read} to him. When the Sultan
read them carefully, he inquired from
his Secretary, whether there ^{was} anything
else in those letters that might
incriminate Abbas Effendi. No.
There ^{was} nothing else. he answered.
~~Then the Sultan said:~~— These letters are very strange
indeed. I do not know what to
do with ~~them~~. Suppose ~~that~~
all the Bahais are destroyed by
the Shah in Persia ^{and suffocated} & I may also
kill those ~~that are~~ living
in my country. What ~~can~~ we
do with these Americans. It
is impossible to do away ^{with}
them. I am puzzled what course
to take." The Secretary ^{said} "I have

often said to your Majesty that these people ~~do~~^{are} not interfering with Polities. It ~~was~~^{is} better to leave them to themselves. Because if any harm comes to Abbas Effendi at this time, his followers in America will create many complications for you, which will be most difficult for ~~of~~ any of us to unravel."

~~This~~ Rasheed Pasha who was here today was once the most powerful Governor-general of all Syria. ~~He~~^{and} was moreover the confident spy of Abdul Hamid. All the inhabitants of Syria were afraid of him. If he reported^{by cable} to the Sultan that any man or any number of men ~~were~~ plotting against him, ~~they~~^{in a day} disappeared. Once Abdyl Bahjji wrote. "Once I told him that a few members of Americans had come to see ~~me~~^{him}; that they had certain religious and

Our two guests having departed the Master ^{he} went out again with Doctor Mohomed Khan. These days he is becoming so restless, ^{and} ~~for~~ I believe ^{our} the Paris sojourn is drawing to a close. He returned after one hour and ordered dinner. ^{but} ~~He~~ did not eat himself. Faithful Sayad Assadallah, however kept ^{a dish} something for him to be carried to his room about eleven o'clock.
