written with his own Blessed
Hand. In one of his ^{arduous} poems he
~~asked~~ ^{asked} him to reveal for him
a Tablet. His nom-de-plume
is the "Baker." Here is the Tablet.
To his honor Aga Haraj
Upon him be Bala Wallah
El Akha!
He is The True One!

His Honor Aga Khan like unto the
wind swept across the deserts
and like unto the birds soared
over mountains and seas till
he arrived in Paris. Here he became
the companion and the intimate
friend of Abdul Baha. O God!
protect this rare soul from the
evil influence of the erring ones
and grant unto him a shelter
and asylum under the shade
of the Blessed Tree. Engage
his tongue in sweet melody
like unto the thankful birds
so that day and night he may
spend his time in Thy glorifi-
cation and praise!

In the afternoon I read Mrs
Wilkins, relations of Mrs.

Agnes Parsons ^{of Washington D.C.} called on the Master
and had a pleasant interview. Mr
Wilkins told ^{him} the Master how the
French Government had set itself
against any religious movement
~~of course~~ notably against the
Catholics. They ^{authorities} have taken out
the name of God "out of all the
Text - books which are studied
by the children in the public
schools. The Government has
also spies everywhere to find
out whether any of the officials
are Catholics. If ^a ~~any of the~~ Catholics
~~are~~ in the service of the Republic,
~~if he cannot go to the church~~
~~or a person Catholic in faith~~
~~cannot find a position in~~
~~Government.~~ The Master
~~deplored~~ these radical measures
and said if such is the case

the future of the ^{French} Republic is ⁴ fraught
with great danger. It cannot stand
on such a theistic foundation.
In America people are religious,
they are attached, they are inves-
tigated, they are open-minded.
They praise God. You find there
many spiritual people. The
name of Mrs Parsons was ^{mentioned}
by the Master with great affection.
On their departure the Beloved
gave to each a lamp.

At six o'clock Saphdor
called on the Master and spent
more than an hour in
his presence.

This morning I transcribed
the beautiful talk of the
Master on Individuality,
Personality and character.
